We serve Big Horn, Carbon, Fergus, Golden Valley, Musselshell, Petroleum, Rosebud, Stillwater, Sweet Grass, Treasure, Wheatland and Yellowstone counties. We are so proud to house the Eastern Montana AHEC team at RiverStone Health.

Expanded to the Billings office in 2007, Eastern Montana AHEC serves approximately 850 students a year with clinical rotations, shadowing hours, community training and outreach opportunities.

Eastern Montana AHEC is the Billings WWAMI (Washington, Wyoming, Alaska, Montana and Idaho) Track office (University of Washington School of Medicine). AHEC is also Montana's AETC (AIDS Education and Training Center).



Heads Up introduces Montana high school students to behavioral health professional pathways and helps them become champions for their community.

This camp is August 4-7 and free. Applications are due May 17.



Management of Aggressive Behaviors (MOAB) is a deescalation skills training for recognizing, reducing and managing aggressive behavior. The program provides human and compassionate methods of dealing with emotionally heightened and potentially aggressive people. The training takes 4 hours to complete, and is skills-based, so participants will be engaging in scenarios and hands-on activities.



Positive Approach to Care Workshop is for family members and professionals to learn the basics of dementia and dementia care.

This full-day training provides attendees with the skills and abilities they need to assist those living with dementia.
